

In addition, he has academic experience in the field of law, with an emphasis on labour law, public labour administration and labour inspection. Anna has extensive and diverse experience in industrial relations spanning 45 years, working with unions, private, and public sectors. From 2012 to 2020 Anna served as FairWork Ombudsman at the FWC; Australia's workplace relations tribunal. She was instrumental in setting up the FWC's Collaborative Approaches Program, formally known as the New Approaches Program.

Prior to taking up her role as FairWork Ombudsman AND at the FWC, Anna was Chair and a non-executive member of the Slater and Gordon board. She held this role since the law firm's listing on the ASX in 2007. Anna also sat on various boards, including the Commonwealth Bank of Australia, the Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games and insurer NRMA, as well as industry superannuation owned financial services companies ME Bank and IFM.
